Hemingway

Hemingway, a three-part, six-hour documentary film by Ken Burns and Lynn Novick, examines the visionary work and the turbulent life of Ernest Hemingway, one of the greatest and most influential writers America has ever produced. Interweaving his eventful biography with carefully selected excerpts from his iconic short stories, novels, and non-fiction, the series reveals the brilliant, ambitious, charismatic, and complicated man behind the myth, and the art he created.

The series tracks the meteoric rise and tragic fall of the author who, in his final years, suffered from chronic alcoholism, traumatic brain injuries and serious mental illness. In 1961, at the age of 61, Hemingway died by suicide, leaving behind an unparalleled body of artistic work and a complicated emotional legacy for those closest to him.

The filmmakers explore the painstaking process through which Hemingway created some of the most important works of fiction in American letters, including novels *The Sun Also Rises*, *A Farewell to Arms*, *For Whom the Bell Tolls* and *The Old Man and the Sea*; short stories “Hills Like White Elephants,” “The Short and Happy Life of Francis Macomber,” and “The Snows of Kilimanjaro;” as well as the nonfiction works *Death in the Afternoon* and *A Moveable Feast*.



Ernest Hemingway “loved being in love,” the writer Michael Katakis says in the film. He married four times over the course of his tumultuous life and had three sons. His relationships with women—his mother, sisters, wives and the World War I nurse who broke his heart—profoundly affected his work. Yet for all his bravado and hyper-masculine posturing, Hemingway wrote about relationships between men and women with sensitivity, nuance and clarity.

The series features an all-star cast of actors, bringing Hemingway (voiced by Jeff Daniels), his friends and family vividly to life. Through letters to and from his four wives, the film reveals Hemingway at his most romantic and his most vulnerable, grappling at times with insecurity, anxiety and existential loneliness.

MASTERPIECE

Atlantic Crossing

A friendship forged in war is beautifully portrayed by Kyle MacLachlan (Twin Peaks) as U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt and Swedish star Sofia Helin as Norwegian Crown Princess Martha in “Atlantic Crossing,” based on a true story of passion and politics, airing in eight episodes during **Masterpiece**’s 50th season.

“Atlantic Crossing” opens in 1939 with a goodwill visit by Norwegian Crown Prince Olav and Crown Princess Martha to the United States where they befriend President Roosevelt and the first lady. Months later, Norway is fighting for survival as Nazi Germany invades the neutral country with the goal of seizing its strategic ports and securing access to iron ore mines for steel production.

During the assault, German troops try to capture the Norwegian royal family for use as bargaining chips, but the King and Olav manage to escape to England

where they establish a government-in-exile. Meanwhile, Martha and the three children make their hazardous way to America where they are taken in at the White House by President Roosevelt.

This sets the stage for an epic drama that mixes war and diplomacy, desire and jealousy. At the outset, America is officially neutral. It would be political suicide if Roosevelt defies the strong isolationist sentiment in the U.S., yet

Martha urges him to find a way to help Norway in the fight against Germany.

Meanwhile across the ocean, Olav grows increasingly suspicious of Martha’s close ties to the president. The relationship also tries the patience of the first lady and the president’s rumored paramour, Missy LeHand (Lucy Russell).

For Martha, the whole experience is an education like no other, as the shy and beautiful crown princess must play the roles of public figure, confidante, statesman, and single mother, while she anxiously awaits the outcome of the war.

Enjoy **Masterpiece**’s “Atlantic Crossing” on 3-2 Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 4th. It repeats Fridays at 11:00 p.m. beginning the 9th. On 3-1 it airs Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 4th and repeats Mondays at 1:00 p.m.



AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

American Oz

“American Oz,” a two-hour **American Experience** presentation, tells the remarkable story of the man behind one of the most beloved and quintessential American classics.

When L. Frank Baum published *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* in 1900, he was 44 years old and had spent much of his life in restless pursuit of his American dream.

After working and failing at a string of odd jobs that honed his instincts for showmanship—chicken breeder, actor, marketer of petroleum products, shopkeeper, newspaperman and traveling salesman—Baum and his family headed west from their home in Syracuse, New York, in 1888.

During his travels from Chicago to the Great Plains during the American frontier’s final days, he witnessed a nation coming to terms with the economic uncertainty of the Gilded Age. But he never lost his childlike sense of wonder and eventually crafted his observations into an enduring, magical tale of survival, adventure and self-discovery.

“American Oz” on **American Experience** airs on 3-2 Monday, the 19th at 8:00 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Sunday, the 25th at 9:00 p.m.



Never Too Late: The Doc Severinsen Story

After three decades as the colorful bandleader to “The Tonight Show” starring Johnny Carson, master trumpeter Doc Severinsen defies nature with a relentless schedule of touring and performing into his nineties. A beloved musical icon traces his groundbreaking career and personal trials underscoring a life of inspiration and obsession, in **American Masters** “Never Too Late: The Doc Severinsen Story.”



The film features original interviews with friends, colleagues and famous fans inspired by the music icon, including Jimmy Fallon and master trumpeters Chris Botti and Arturo Sandoval, as well as intimate conversations with the irreverent, irrepressible Severinsen and his family members.

Oliver Sacks: His Own Life



“Oliver Sacks: His Own Life” on **American Masters** is the story of a beloved doctor and writer who redefined our understanding of the brain and mind. The two-hour film explores the life and work of the legendary neurologist and storyteller as he shares intimate details of his battles with drug addiction, homophobia and a medical establishment that embraced his work only decades after the fact.

In February 2015, a few weeks after receiving a terminal cancer diagnosis, Sacks sat down with filmmaker Ric Burns for a series of interviews. For 80 hours, surrounded by family, friends and notebooks from six decades of thinking and writing about the brain, Sacks talked about his life and work, his abiding sense of wonder at the natural world and the place of human beings within it. “His Own Life” draws on these deeply personal reflections.

My Grandparents' War

Combining key moments in history with compelling personal stories, **My Grandparents' War** is a new four-part series that takes a fascinating journey into the past to understand the extraordinary impact of World War II on the families of four British actors.

Helena Bonham Carter, Mark Rylance, Kristin Scott Thomas and Carey Mulligan each host a one-hour journey into their respective family histories as they travel to historic locations—from the beaches of Dunkirk to the former site of a prisoner-of-war camp in Hong Kong—to retrace their grandparents' footsteps during the conflict that changed their lives forever.

All four Hollywood stars have unanswered questions about the scars the war left on their grandparents. In each episode of **My Grandparents' War**, they'll discover remarkable stories of bravery amid the most harrowing circumstances, uncovering the life-and-death decisions their grandparents were forced to make. The series examines universal themes of love, courage and self-sacrifice through the dramatic human stories of ordinary people caught up in one of the most horrific wars of all time.

Philly D.A.

INDEPENDENT LENS

In 2017, Larry Krasner, a civil rights attorney who sued the Philadelphia Police Department 75 times throughout his career, mounted a longshot campaign and ultimately won the District Attorney's seat in a city that has the highest incarceration rate of any large city in the United States. Krasner ran on a bold pledge: to end mass incarceration by changing the culture of the criminal justice system from within.

Now, the bureaucrats Krasner spent his campaign denigrating are his co-workers; the police he alienated are his rank-and-file law enforcers. Pressure comes from all sides of a system resistant to reform. Krasner's unapologetic promise to use the power of the D.A.'s office for sweeping change is what got him elected; now that he's in office, that same stubbornness threatens to alienate those he needs to work with the most.

Philly D.A., an eight-part series, brings viewers inside the emotional, high-stakes work that Krasner and an ensemble of idealistic outsiders from different walks of life take on as they attempt a fundamental overhaul of an expansive, entrenched criminal justice system. Filmed over three years, the series follows Krasner's team as they push reforms such as prosecuting police misconduct and brutality, rethinking sentencing, probation and parole reform, minimizing the use of cash bail, and ending pursuit of the death penalty.

Through real-time interviews with Krasner, his team, and those who disagree with his approach, including prosecutors in his own district attorney's office, sitting judges, victims of crime, and law enforcement officials, **Philly D.A.** captures a never-before-seen, in-depth look inside the justice system as an old and new guard clash.

Picture a Scientist

"Picture a Scientist," a two-hour **Nova**, confronts the largely under-reported struggles endured by women scientists through candid sit-downs with a geologist, a chemist and a retired biologist. The inspiring film illuminates both the hard data and the very human stories of women in science.

Today, women make up less than one quarter of all those employed in STEM occupations (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) in the U.S. These numbers are much worse for women of color who made up slightly less than 10% of working scientists and engineers in the country in 2015. Researchers agree that these bleak numbers are evidence of deep bias.

Over the course of careers, the experiences of women scientists range from brutal harassment to years of subtle slights that add up to prevent many of them from achieving leadership positions in STEM fields. But now, the terrain is shifting.

Reef Rescue

As climate change warms the oceans, coral reefs are dying, putting marine ecosystems and the billions of humans that rely on them at grave risk. At the current pace, coral reefs could be wiped out by the end of the century, but efforts are underway to try to counteract this catastrophe.

"Reef Rescue" on **Nova** follows scientists who are scrambling to find new ways to save the reefs using a technique called assisted evolution. Can crossbreeding seemingly more resilient corals with one another produce heat-resistant offspring? Or perhaps an algae transplant will give dying corals a second chance at survival? From the Bahamas to Christmas Island to Australia, marine biologists fight against a ticking clock to save the coral reefs from extinction.

Fighting for Fertility

Whether it's flash-freezing an egg to minus 197 degrees, or searching for sperm where there seems to be none, the high-tech world of assisted reproduction is ushering in a new era of possibilities. As same-sex couples, transgender individuals, single parents, and people with fertility issues have the opportunity to build a family using their own DNA, humanity is redefining what it means to reproduce.

In the United States, some 10% of people struggle with infertility. "Fighting for Fertility" on **Nova** explores barriers to fertility, from the social to the biological, and the state of assisted reproductive technologies. Follow the journeys of couples navigating IVF, the world of mosaic embryos, and other options for having a baby.

Down a Dark Stairwell

On a fall day in 2014, Peter Liang, a Chinese American police officer, shot and killed an innocent, unarmed black man named Akai Gurley. Unfolding in the dark stairwell of a Brooklyn housing project, the shooting inflamed the residents of New York City and thrust two marginalized communities into the uneven criminal justice system. In the end, Liang became the first NYPD officer in over a decade to hear a guilty verdict in such a case.

In the wake of Gurley's death, cries of police brutality rang out to join a chorus protesting the recent police killings of two other unarmed black men in Staten Island and Ferguson, Missouri. And just days after the Gurley incident, an officer in Cleveland, Ohio, shot and killed a 12-year-old African American boy playing with a toy gun.

In this anguished debate, a rallying point was the pronounced pattern of police officers, mostly white, avoiding criminal prosecution. Liang, however, was hit with a charge of manslaughter and received a guilty verdict.

Baseball might be on hiatus, but fans can relive the history of America's pastime thanks to a nice gesture by award-winning filmmaker Ken Burns. Burns asked PBS to stream his documentary for free, at pbs.org and all PBS digital platforms. He hopes that the sport can continue to bring people together even as the MLB season is delayed due to the coronavirus outbreak.

The documentary **Baseball** originally aired in September 1994. The nine-part series—divided into "innings," in the spirit of a baseball game—introduces viewers to baseball and traces the history of the sport from its origins in the 1800s up through the early 1990s.

"The story of **Baseball** is the story of America," said PBS. "It is an epic overflowing with heroes and hopefuls, scoundrels and screwballs. It is a saga spanning the quest for racial justice, the clash of labor and management, the transformation of popular culture, and the unfolding of the national pastime."

Burns leaves fans with a simple message: "Stay healthy, and let's look after each other. Play ball."

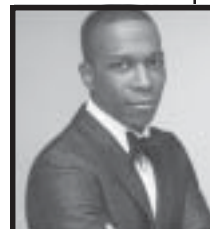

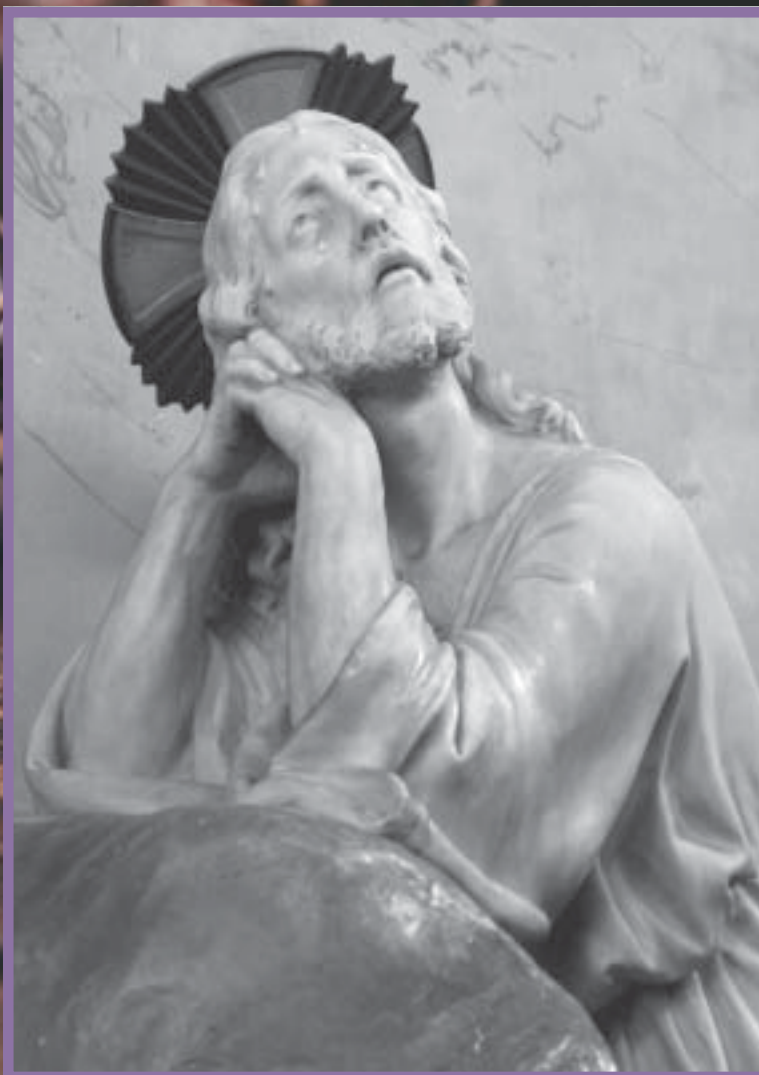
