Fauci: The Virus Hunter

Digging deep into the life of the scientific expert who strives to promote facts over fear.

Fauci: The Virus Hunter takes an in-depth look at Dr. Anthony Stephen Fauci's life and career, from the groundbreaking clinical investigator whose work in vasculitis remains the standard of care to becoming director of the National Institute of Allergies and Infectious Diseases, with two major health crises bookending his career, AIDS and COVID-19.

From his childhood in Brooklyn to present day, the documentary unveils the man behind the top U.S. infectious disease expert, detailing his contributions to medicine throughout his extensive career which includes advising seven U.S. presidents against the world's top virulent enemies and becoming a household name during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fauci: The Virus Hunter reveals the intrepid scientist and the family man. It offers viewers new insight into the man who began his medical career making deliveries by bicycle for his father's pharmacy in Brooklyn and has strived to bring that level of direct connection to the public to promote facts over fear.

Interviews with Dr. Fauci's distinguished colleagues and friends, along with archival footage and photos, give an expansive view of the depth and breadth of his contributions and service to the United States and the world.

The documentary sheds light on the many battles fought, challenges overcome, and significant discoveries made during Fauci's

esteemed career. As one of the first researchers to recognize the significance of the HIV virus and the impact it would have, Fauci shifted the focus of his lab and ultimately his career from immunology to infectious disease, considered a risk at the time.

The film offers a look back at Dr. Fauci's role in the fight during the 1980s AIDS, SARS, influenza viruses, Zika, Ebola, and COVID-19, intertwined with profiles of patients and advocates who worked with him and sometimes protested against him when the early stages of diseases had yet to reveal the best course of action to take.

Fauci: The Virus Hunter will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday, the 14th at 10:00 a.m., Monday, the 15th at 8:00 p.m. and Friday, the 19th at 9:00 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Wednesday, the 17th at 7:00 p.m.

‘Til Kingdom Come/The Debate

Millions of American Evangelicals are praying for the State of Israel. Among them are the Bingham family, a dynasty of Kentucky pastors, and their Evangelical congregants in an impoverished coal mining town. They donate sacrificially to Israel’s foremost philanthropic organization, because they fervently believe the Jews are crucial to Jesus’s return.



“‘Til Kingdom Come/The Debate” on **Independent Lens** traces this unusual relationship, from rural Kentucky to the halls of government in Washington, through the moving of the American Embassy in Jerusalem and to the annexation plan of the West Bank.

The film explores a little-known backstory of the Trump and Netanyahu administrations, where financial, political and messianic motivations intersect with the apocalyptic worldview that is reshaping American foreign policy toward Israel and the Middle East.

“Coded Bias”



Around the world, artificial intelligence has already permeated every facet of public and private life—automating decisions about who gets hired, who gets health insurance and how long a prison term should be—theoretically casting analyses and insights that are free from human prejudice.

In “Coded Bias” on **Independent Lens**, MIT researcher Joy Buolamwini discovers that the majority of facial-recognition software does not accurately identify darker-skinned faces or women. She embarks on an investigation that uncovers widespread bias lurking in the algorithms that have come to shape people’s lives, with very little oversight from public and elected officials.

The film travels to London, where police are piloting the use of facial recognition technology, and to Houston, Texas, where teachers are evaluated via algorithms.

Today, a million species are at risk of extinction. In **Extinction – The Facts**, Sir David Attenborough explores how this crisis of biodiversity has consequences for us all.

Extinction is now happening up to 100 times faster than the natural evolutionary rate, but the issue is about more than the loss of individual species. Everything in the natural world is connected in networks that support the whole of life on earth, including us, and we are losing many of the benefits that nature provides to us.



The loss of insects is threatening the pollination of crops, while the loss of biodiversity in the soil also threatens plants, one in four of which is now threatened with extinction. But the single biggest driver of biodiversity loss is the destruction of natural habitats.

Disease ecologists believe that if we continue on this pathway, this year’s pandemic will not be a one-off event.

A Company of Heroes

Easy Company, the 2nd Battalion of the 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment of the 101st Airborne Division, widely known as the “Screaming Eagles,” remains one of the most revered combat units in U.S. military history. The Army company’s legendary exploits in World War II inspired Stephen Ambrose’s book, *Band of Brothers*, the HBO miniseries of the same name, and the documentary **A Company of Heroes**.

Following two years of hard training, the soldiers of Easy Company parachuted into Normandy on D-Day and, later, into Holland for Operation Market Garden. They fought their way through Belgium, France and Germany, survived overwhelming odds, liberated concentration camps, and drank a victory toast in April 1945 at Hitler’s hideout in the Alps (pictured).

In 2009, 20 of the few remaining survivors from Easy Company recount the horrors and the victories.

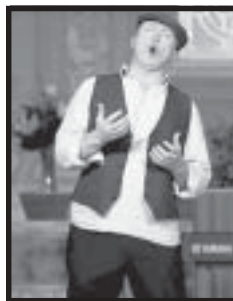

The Blinding of Issac Woodard

"The Blinding of Issac Woodard" on **American Experience** tells the story of the incident of racial violence that dramatically changed the course of history.

In 1946, Isaac Woodard, a Black army sergeant on his way home to South Carolina after serving in WWII, was taken off a Greyhound bus after a heated exchange with the driver, who refused to let him off at a rest stop to use the restroom. The local chief of police savagely beat him, leaving him unconscious and permanently blind.

The shocking incident made national headlines and, when the police chief was acquitted by an all-white jury, the injustice would change the course of American history.

Based on Richard Gergel's book *Unexamined Courage*, the film details how the crime led to the racial awakening of South Carolina Judge J. Waties Waring and President Harry Truman, who desegregated the military and federal offices two years later. It also ultimately set the stage for the Supreme Court's landmark 1954 *Brown v. Board of Education* decision, which finally outlawed segregation in public schools and jumpstarted the modern civil rights movement.
