Surrender on the USS *Missouri*


On September 2nd, 1945, World War II came to its official end aboard a legendary battleship anchored in Tokyo Bay. Some 70 million people had died during the war, but now the fighting would end not with a rifle shot but rather with the swift stroke of a pen. The Surrender Ceremony, which formally brought an end to the bloodiest conflict in human history, lasted a mere 23 minutes.

The USS *Missouri* hadn't been in the fight long, heading into the Pacific theater of war in 1944, but she would become one of the most famous military ships in history.

"Mighty Mo" had been involved in the vicious fight at Iwo Jima and then headed for Okinawa, where she dodged suicidal Kamikaze air attacks during World War II's last great battle.

Missouri would then bomb Japan before being told to leave the coast for no apparent reason. The reason turned out to be two Atomic bombs that were set to be dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

The official surrender ceremony on the USS *Missouri* would attract a world-wide radio audience with famous Pacific commanding General Douglas MacArthur handling the Instrument of Surrender proceedings. Over 3,000 soldiers and dignitaries looked on from



every inch of *Missouri*'s decks, including a small delegation of conquered Japanese.

Surrender on the USS *Missouri* focuses on those who witnessed the official Japanese surrender. Through interviews with those who served on the battleship, the film follows the USS *Missouri* from its construction, through varied battles in the Pacific, to its final resting place as a memorial and museum in Pearl Harbor, not far from another famous battleship, the USS *Arizona*.

Surrender on the USS *Missouri* can be seen on 3-2 Friday, the 28th at 11:00 p.m. and Sunday, the 30th at 6:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Wednesday, the 26th at 7:00 p.m.

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

Billy Graham

During its 33rd season, **American Experience** presents "Billy Graham," a two-hour film about one of the best-known and most significant American Christian leaders of the 20th century. An international celebrity by age 30, he built a media empire, preached to millions worldwide, and had the ear of tycoons, presidents and royalty.

The documentary explores how a young man who grew up on a North Carolina farm rose to become, in the words of *Time* magazine, "America's preacher." A mesmerizing speaker of great personal magnetism and charisma, Graham caught the nation's attention and earned its respect in ways that crossed sectarian and social boundaries.

As an intimate of presidents and other leaders and a public figure of acknowledged moral authority, he attracted thousands to evangelistic campaigns he called "crusades." Often hailed as the most influential Christian preacher in American history, he revitalized American evangelicalism as a movement, not only through his preaching but through the founding of the Billy Graham Evangelical Association and the launching of the movement's magazine, *Christianity Today*.

In addition to serving as a biography of Graham, the film also uses his story as a lens to gain perspective on the evolution of American evangelicalism in the last quarter of the 20th century.

Extra Life: A Short History of Living Longer

Extra Life: A Short History of Living Longer, a four-part series, explores the lessons learned from previous global pandemics—including smallpox, cholera, the Spanish flu and others—and reveals how scientists, doctors, activists and self-experimenters launched a public health revolution, saving millions of lives and doubling the human lifespan in under a century.

Each episode explores one aspect of public health that has played a central role in our battle to live longer.

Vaccines explores the use of vaccination, from early practices in Africa introduced to America during the slave trade and Thomas Jefferson's clinical trials, to the first anti-vax protests in the 19th century and COVID-19 today.

Medical Drugs focuses on the more recent medical inventions that combat illness directly, particularly antibiotics, and the development of antiviral drugs for HIV.

Data looks at how the emergence of fact-based research, data mapping and analysis has improved public health. The practice evolved out of the 19th century science of epidemiology and cholera mortality reports in the 1840s, where the now ubiquitous "curve" of an epidemic was first documented.

Behavior examines the importance of public engagement during a health crisis, from the discovery that the simple act of handwashing could save lives in a 19th century Viennese maternity hospital, to facemasks and lockdowns used to combat the Spanish flu 100 years ago, along with what we are experiencing today.

Extra Life: A Short History of Living Longer airs on 3-2 Tuesdays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 11th and Sundays at 10:00 a.m. beginning the 16th. On 3-1, it airs Tuesdays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 11th.



Hindenburg: New Evidence

Eighty years after the world's largest airship ignited in a giant fireball, newly discovered footage sparks a reinvestigation of what exactly caused the Hindenburg disaster. The infamous Hindenburg crash has baffled experts, with theories about the airship's fire ranging from deliberate sabotage to a spark generated by the stormy conditions in which it landed. But new, never-before-seen amateur footage of the crash has surfaced, showing the airship's final seconds from a fresh angle and in unrivaled clarity.

Taking clues from the footage and other sources, "Hindenburg: New Evidence" on **Nova** leads a fresh investigation at a leading scientific lab with eye-opening experiments that point to a final solution of the mystery.



Great Electric Airplane Race

In "Great Electric Airplane Race," **Nova** looks at the array of promising new electric planes on the horizon and takes you for a ride in some impressive prototypes that are already in the air—such as Burt Rutan's Long-ESA that can fly at over 200 mph and climb to 3,000 feet in under six minutes.

Boeing, Airbus, Raytheon and other major companies are currently racing to develop practical short-haul passenger planes that promise to slash the operating costs and emissions of regular flights. But first, significant hurdles of battery weight, energy storage and cooling must be overcome. How long will it be before the dream of super-quiet, super-efficient airliners becomes a reality?

The Ship that Changed the World

Some five centuries ago, a major revolution overturned traditional ship designs. Since the Roman era, ship builders in Europe and the Mediterranean had been turning out the same tried and true designs and engineering techniques. And then, in the 15th century, within the span of a few short years, ships were transformed from small coastal-bound transports into massive ocean-going vessels capable of long-distance exploration.

The great Native American civilizations were brought down by invading colonists and European diseases. And once regular trans-oceanic travel became feasible, everything changed. Powerful navies arose and fought for supremacy over the land and sea. The influential-if destructive-European empires spread around the globe. The modern world was born. But exactly how did a seem-

ingly modest change in ship design produce such transformative global upheaval?

Modern scholars and historians trying to study exactly what happened at this crucial moment have always faced a problem: There's a hole in our history. All of the ships dating back to this key period of transformation have long ago disappeared, leaving behind only rough drawings and incomplete records. Now the wreck of one of these crucial transitional ships may have been found off the coast of Sweden.

Built around the same time as Columbus' trio of ships, it may finally unlock the engineering secrets of those famous ships and provide physical evidence of the engineering breakthroughs that helped create the modern world. Dive with **Nova** as we search underwater to reveal the secrets of this amazing discovery.

High-Risk, High-Rise

Over the past few decades, the number of skyscrapers worldwide has climbed dramatically. As developers look to maximize limited urban space and nations vie for prestige, these shimmering towers are being built higher and higher.

In China alone, dozens of buildings rise to over 1,000 feet, with a few approaching 2,000 feet. But for all their impressive engineering, are these buildings safe? And are building regulations keeping up with the soaring heights of new structures?

In San Francisco, skyscrapers can be built on unstable, sinking ground. And internal sprinkler systems are the only hope for extinguishing fires that burn beyond the reach of firefighters' ladders.

Now, "High-Risk, High Rise" on **Nova** explores the science behind the risks of sky-high buildings, from the structural limits of building materials to the threats presented by wind, fire and earthquakes. Experts show how the science of evacuation has shaped buildings in recent years, and what we have—and haven't—learned from past tragedies.

Amy Tan: Unintended Memoir

Writer Amy Tan's hit debut novel, "The Joy Luck Club" (1989), catapulted her to commercial and critical success, spending over 40 weeks on *The New York Times* Best Seller list. With the 1993 blockbuster film adaption that followed, as well as additional bestselling novels, librettos, short stories and memoirs, Tan firmly established herself as one of the most prominent and respected literary voices working today.

American Masters "Amy Tan: Unintended Memoir" is an intimate portrait of the groundbreaking author's life and career. The documentary premieres on PBS in May in honor of Asian Pacific American Heritage Month.

AMERICAN MASTERS



"Amy Tan: Unintended Memoir" is the last completed film from director James Redford (Robert Redford's son, 1962-2020). Tan opens up to Redford with remarkable frankness about traumas she's faced in her life and how her writing has helped her heal.

Born to Chinese immigrant parents in Oakland, California in 1952, it would be decades before Tan would come to fully understand how her mother's battle with suicidal tendencies was rooted in a legacy of suffering common to women who survived the ancient Chinese tradition of concubinage. However, this legacy provides Tan an inexhaustible well of creative inspiration, and her work has made her a global icon for

Asian Americans. The film is an inside look at a brave artist whose humanity infuses all of her work.

Tan's other bestselling novels include "The Kitchen God's Wife," "The Hundred Secret Senses," "The Bonesetter's Daughter," "Saving Fish from Drowning" and "The Valley of Amazement," and her work has been translated into 35 languages.

The Donut King

Hard knocks, redemption, wealth, survival, risk, and donuts—Ted Ngoy's life story has it all. "The Donut King" on **Independent Lens** is the story of one man's American Dream, with a (glazed) twist.

In 1975, Ted Ngoy escaped the Khmer Rouge in Cambodia, arriving in America via Camp Pendleton, California. Starting as a gas station janitor, he parlayed diligence and luck into the purchase of his first donut shop, launching a multi-million dollar fried pastry empire.

Starting in Orange County, California, his Christy's Doughnuts consortium continued to expand, providing a unique opportunity for Ngoy to lend a helping hand to his former countrymen and women. He sponsored hundreds of visas for incoming Cambodian refugees and offered them steady employment in his donut shops.

By the mid-1980s, Ngoy was living his version of the American Dream: owner of multiple homes, driving fancy cars, taking lavish vacations, and officially becoming an American citizen. But a great rise often comes with a great fall. "The Donut King" explores immigration, assimilation, prejudice, and who gets access to The American Dream—and what happens when you achieve it.

The Chinese Exclusion Act

The Chinese Exclusion Act—signed into law in 1882 and repealed sixty-one years later in 1943—gave shape to the American debate over immigration and national identity.

On the eve of the greatest wave of immigration in American history, President Chester A. Arthur signed into law the Chinese Exclusion Act that singled out as never before a specific race and nationality for exclusion, making it illegal for Chinese workers to come to America and for Chinese nationals already here ever to become citizens of the United States. "The Chinese Exclusion Act," a two-hour film on **American Experience**, explores this little known yet revealing episode in American history.

Despite the fact that the almost entirely male Chinese American population in 1880 amounted to less than two-tenths of one percent of the entire American population, virulently racist anti-Chinese sentiment spread across the country. In 1876, as Reconstruction collapsed in the South, anti-black interests in the former Confederacy converged with anti-Chinese sentiments in the Far West, creating a growing consensus in the halls of Congress—among Democrats and Republicans alike—that something had to be done.

Over the next thirty years, as subsequent federal legislation barred families from being re-united, outlawed inter-racial marriages, prevented Chinese Americans from re-entering the country after visit-

ing loved ones at home, and barred Chinese from owning property and businesses, Chinese Americans fought back.

Unable to vote, Chinese Americans filed no fewer than 10,000 lawsuits in American courts, in some cases leading to landmark decisions establishing bedrock American principles, regarding birth-right citizenship, rights to education, and equal protection under the law, as guaranteed by the 14th Amendment. The amendment's spare eighty-word text defining the rights of all "persons" born or naturalized in the United States formed a slender line of defense for the Chinese in America in the second half of the 19th century—as the country descended into an abyss of hatred and violence directed against all people of color.

In 1943, Franklin Roosevelt maneuvered legislation through Congress repealing the three generation-long exclusion laws. But it was not until 1965, when the Hart-Cellar Act prioritized the reunification of families and the immigration of professionals, that Chinese were able to legally immigrate and naturalize in larger numbers.

Tulsa: The Fire and the Forgotten

One of the worst incidents of racial violence in American history occurred 100 years ago, May 31–June 1, 1921. Known as the Tulsa Race Massacre, a mob of white residents set fire to “Black Wall Street”—hundreds of Black-owned businesses and homes in the Greenwood district of Tulsa, Oklahoma—killing an estimated 100–300 Black residents and leaving an estimated 10,000 Black residents homeless.

Tulsa: The Fire and the Forgotten, a two-hour film, examines this deadly assault on the 100th anniversary of the crime in the context of other racial massacres and police killings.

This explosion of racial terror was compounded by the silence that followed. No one was punished for the crimes committed, and history textbooks often made no reference to them, so many Americans are still unaware of this history.

“Uncle Vanya” begins as Sonya and her Uncle Vanya (Toby Jones) throw their lives into maintaining the crumbling family estate occasionally visited by the radical and inspiring local doctor Astrov (Richard Armitage). However, when Sonya’s father, Professor Serebryakov, suddenly returns with his restless, alluring new wife, Yelena (Rosalind Eleazar), long-hidden truths begin to emerge.

Spiritual Audacity: The Abraham Joshua Heschel Story

Spiritual Audacity: The Abraham Joshua Heschel Story chronicles the life and legacy of the Polish-born rabbi who escaped to the United States from Nazi Germany and became one of the 20th century’s most prominent Jewish theologians, philosophers and civil rights activists.

The descendant of Hasidic rabbis and a “brand plucked from the fire” of the Holocaust, Dr. Heschel (1907–72) was a friend and ally of Martin Luther King, Jr., and spoke out boldly against war and racial injustice. Heschel considered racism, “man’s gravest threat to man—the maximum of hatred for a minimum of reason.”

Heschel helped begin a new friendship between Jews and Catholics, opposed the Viet Nam War, and brought the Hebrew prophets to life—not only by his words, but also by his deeds. He believed that the search for the divine and for human spirituality is inseparable from the search for a just society.

Spiritual Audacity: The Abraham Joshua Heschel Story airs on 3-2 Sunday, the 9th at 10:00 a.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Tuesday, the 11th at 7:00 p.m.



INSIDE THE MET

In three-part series, this great institution makes history in ways no one could have predicted.

New York City's Metropolitan Museum of Art is the largest art museum in the Americas. At five floors high and four city blocks long, it is home to 2.3 million square feet of artistic treasures. As the Met prepares to celebrate its 150th birthday with a treasure trove of landmark exhibitions, COVID-19 strikes. The world shuts down and, for the first time in its history, the Met closes its doors indefinitely. A skeleton staff battles to protect 1.2 million precious objects while executives face losses approaching \$150 million.

With the resurgence of the Black Lives Matter movement and renewed calls for social justice, the Met is also forced to confront their historical record on inclusion, exclusion and diversity in art and staffing, as questions are raised about some of the Met's most treasured objects.

As fall 2020 begins, the Metropolitan Museum of Art has reopened, and every department is calling in favors to patrons and supporters, from old money philanthropists who have contributed millions over generations, to art collectors now realizing it is time to make public their private treasures.
