**Report from Santa Fe  
with Lorene Mills  
4th Quarter 2018**

**Weekly 30 minute program videotaped at the  
New Mexico State Capitol Building in Santa Fe.**

- 10/06/18 Ex Governor Garrey Carruthers (now Chancellor of New Mexico State University) and former senior Senator from New Mexico, Jeff Bingaman, are guests discussing ethics, the current political climate, and ethics commissions and groups.
- 10/13/18 Valerie Plame, now an author, discusses the world of spies, both real and fictional. She is an ex-CIA agent who was “outed” during the Bush Administration because her husband had written a op-ed piece highly critical of that administration’s reason for going to war in Iraq.
- 10/20/18 Dede Feldman, former N.M. State Senator (now an author) and Kathleen Sabo, the executive director of New Mexico Ethics Watch talk about the proposed Ethics Commission that will be voted upon in the November General Election.
- 10/27/18 Martha Burk, political psychologist and author of the book *Your Voice, Your Vote* tells that Women are now the majority of registered voters and are the majority of people that show

up at the polls and actually vote. She states that women need to vote their own interests and her book talks about all political issues as they affect women, not just so-called women's issues.

- 11/03/18 David Harvey, Part 1, is a distinguished professor of anthropology and geography at City University of New York and an author of some 25 books, one of which is a primer on the topic of Neoliberalism; its title is *A Brief History of Neoliberalism*. This is the topic of a two part program. In addition, economic theory and Marx are discussed on this first program.
- 11/10/18 Hampton Sides, prolific author who discusses some of his books, including *Ghost Soldiers*; it was made into a film and is about the Bataan Death March in World War II and a rescue that took place late in the war to get the last of the survivors of the death march rescued from Japanese executions. Another of his books discussed is *Blood and Thunder: an Epic of the American West*, about the conquest of the American West.
- 11/17/18 Michael McGarrity, New Mexico author, talks about some of the 16 books that he has written, including his brand new novel, *Residue*. Thirteen of his books are the much beloved Kevin Kerney series. He explains how he stepped aside from the crime series for some 10 years to do the *American West Trilogy*, simply because it kept growing in his mind that this was a family saga that really needed to be told, a New Mexican family saga.
- 11/24/18 Muhammad Yunus is a global star; Nobel Peace Prize winner, Gandhi Peace Prize winner, Presidential Medal of Freedom, and a Congressional Gold Medal. He is founder of the Grameen Bank and father of micro-credit and micro-loans, an economic movement that has brought millions and millions of people out of poverty. Mr. Yunus was in Santa Fe to serve as the honorary chair of the Santa Fe International Folk Art Market.
- 12/01/18 Richard Rhodes is a historian, journalist, and fiction and non-fiction author of numerous books, including a nuclear history series. Mr. Rhodes was in Santa Fe to give a speech correlated with the Santa Fe Opera's presentation of an opera called *Dr. Atomic*, about the life and times of Oppenheimer, the father of the atomic bomb.
- 12/08/18 Dede Feldman, author and N.M. State Senator for 16 years, explains how average citizens can successfully advocate their causes in her book *Inside the New Mexico Senate: Boots, Suits, and Citizens*. Lorene also discusses with Ms. Feldman her new book *Another Way Forward: Grass Roots Solutions from New Mexico* and says that it is an inspiring, positive, and encouraging book at a time when we really do need all the encouragement we can get.
- 12/15/18 Connie Willis and Melinda Snodgrass discuss their books and activities on today's program. Connie is a decorated science fiction writer and a winner of many awards including the Hugos and the Nebulas. She also conducts writers' workshops where young writers can learn from her experience and brilliance. Melinda Snodgrass is a screenwriter, a gamer, an opera singer, a lawyer, an equestrienne, and she has written for *Star Trek, the Next Generation*. In addition, she is the brand new executive producer for the upcoming series, *Wild Cards*.
- 12/22/18 David Harvey, Part 2, is considered a bit of a rock star because his writings have been so influential in worlds of anthropology, geography, and economics. He is the distinguished professor of anthropology and geography at City University of New York and the author of about 25 books. In this second program, he talks about his background, how he started in geography, how he moved on to social justice, and then into very influential and profound economic work.
- 12/29/18 Jeff Berg is the author of *New Mexico Filmmaking* and most recently *Historic Movie Theaters of New Mexico*. The latter book goes documents all the old towns and the beautiful old movie theaters that existed. Mr. Berg talks with Lorene about the history of filmmaking in

New Mexico, starting with the very first film shot in 1897. He explained that New Mexico was the first state in the union to have a Film Commission, which was established by Governor Dave Cargo.
